STUDENT ICT AND INTERNET AGREEMENT



These key points form the ICT and Internet use agreement we ask you follow whilst attending projects at the YMCA.

We ask that these are signed and agreed to before using the ICT facilities.

Failure to do so may mean you will not be allowed to use the computer facilities and the

Internet

- We ask all students to act responsibly and safely when using computers and the Internet, just as
 they are elsewhere in the building. This includes material they choose to access and language
 they use.
- The YMCA provides filtered Internet access for safe browsing by students. Students do not
 deliberately search the Internet for offensive material-this includes websites showcasing violence
 or information of a sexual nature which is not educational. If any student finds offensive material
 accidentally, we ask they report it immediately to staff.
- Students using email should only contact people they know or those approved by the staff
- Students should not use rude language in e-mail communication. No personal information such as phone numbers and addresses should be given out and no arrangements made to meet strangers.
- Students should not access chat rooms or send chain letters when using computers.
- Students should not access other people's files unless permission has been given.
- Computers should only be used for work and homework. As each student is given a
 fixed amount of network space for their work, all files including pictures should be removed
 when they are no longer needed. It is particularly important that students do not save many
 picture files as these take up a large amount of network space.
- Students are not allowed to download any program files from the Internet or by using e-mail.
 Similarly, students are not allowed to bring any computer programs on any type of removable media from home for use in the YMCA.
- · Students may use printers for work only.
- Students failing to follow the terms of this contract will be warned, and subsequently, may be denied access to computer facilities and the Internet.

The City of Bradford YMCA takes reports of bullying seriously.

Any learner found to be threatening or abusive to others whilst using the internet may be subject to formal disciplinary.

If you feel you are being unfairly treated by other ICT users please report your concerns to a staff member.
